The speaker will report on what the ANS delegation learned during their trip to the World Summit on Sustainability in Johannesburg in 2002. Listeners will learn an overview of how the meetings are conducted and the complex dynamics of energy policy in the world political process.

Dr. Loewen spent 10 years in the Nuclear Navy, then went on to attain his Masters in Nuclear Engineering from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1992. After 5 years with an environmental firm as Director of their nuclear applications program, he returned to UW-M for his Ph.D. in Engineering Physics. He is employed by the Idaho National Laboratory researching Generation IV reactor systems, however, is currently serving as the ANS Seaborg Congressional Fellow for Senator Chuck Hagel (R-NE) working on legislation regarding Global Climate Change.
